





A sacrifice that is, probably, one of the few hopes left over this piece of land..


Maybe by our loyalty to this institution we will not gain materialistic achievements..

ETHICS AND THE MEDICAL PROFESSION

This is a rarely mentioned topic, as if the loss of values and lack of ethics around us are excuses for the medical profession to lose its standrds and values. Ever since the time of Hippocrates, the medical profession has set the example in high standards of ethical professional behaviour, and has gained wide-spread acclaim for that. Physicians have always been the confidants of their patients, and have in truth been dedicated to the care and healing of the sick. Unfortunately some physicians break the oath they had solemnly taken at their graduation, tarnishing not only their image but that of the profession as a whole. Ethical values are the basic core governing not only the physicians' relationship with their patients but also the relationship of physicians with colleagues and other members of the health team, as well as the physicians own behaviour and moral integrity.

In the physician-patient relationship, confidentiality is of utmost importance. In our zeal, we are apt to discuss intimate details of our patients in crowded corridors, elevators, coffee shops and social gatherings, forgetting that non-physicians are present. Courtesy and compassion to patients and their families must always be the standard of our dealings. Above all, we must be concerned about our patients, a concern that includes their financial status and their ability to meet medical expenses.

The doctor- doctor relationship, or in a wider sense, the realtionship between physicians and other members of the health team, is another area where our ethical standards are below par. Backbiting and propagation of deleterious gossip is occasionally seen. We are apt to forget that physicians have to safeguard their colleagues' reputation as if it were their own. Physicians should show respect to nurses, support personnel and others in the team with regard of human dignity especially as the very function of the «physician» is so dependent on his/her team-mates.

The medical profession is proud that it attracts the cream of college graduates. Its ranks comprise intelligent people who have worked hard to become physicians. The A.U.B.M.C. is endowed with human resources difficult to match: the student body, housestaff and medical staff. These people should be the intellectual leaders in the community - and as such they have even greater obligations as role models for others to


follow. Physicians all over deal with the most precious of commodities: human life (active, useful and happy life), and their obligations are tremendous to match the expectations of their communities.

To their patients they are semi-gods. But of course we as physicians are only humans, act and react as humans beings, and interact with, and affected by, our surroundings. Some degree of apathy and disillusion are apt to occur. But should this erode all the investment, credentials and the very essence of the moral fiber and professional intergrity that make the physician? Should not each physician and physician- to- be have the obligation not only to regain the values and esteem but also set examples for others to follow?

Khalil Abu Faysal, MD (Chaiman) «Are you kidding?»

There is a widely prevalent belief that the study of Medicine requires the exclusion of all other intellectual activity and the life-long devotion of one's time and mental energy. In my opinion nothing can be further from the truth. True, the art has become much longer since the days of Hippocrates Also true, in Medical School and during the early post-doctoral training period there is an ovewhelming amount of information, much of it expressed in a new and strange language, to be leant, and no degree of native intelligence can replace hard work in the learning of it. Yet in every group of medical students there are those who find the time to do many other interesting and creative thing besides learning medical facts. Not accidentally, these are usually the better students, are they go on to become the better physicians. How do they manage?

I think they manage because they have developed the ability to use time effectively and to decide what to learn and how to learn it. I do not underestimate the importance of keeping abreast of pertinent information. But, considering the brief half-life of medical factual knowledge, I feel that much of keeping up with the literature is a little like «keeping up with the joneses». After all, one could retire into a cell, real or imaginary, and devote all one's life to the study of medical writings; but then life piled on life would not suffice, and one would lose touch with and interest in people. Who can be a good physician who is not interested in people?.

The only way to learn medicine that «stays learnt» is to master, early on, its scientific basis, which changes quite slowly; to develop the critical faculty, again early in one's career (the lucky ones do it even before medical school); to make full use of the opportunity to learn independently from patients rather than to depend on teachers; to develop the ability to bring everything that one has learnt to bear on the problem at hand; to acquire the flexibility and humility necessary to admit ignorance or error and to unlearn what has been superseded; and to maintain a life-long sense of curiosity and wonder. A student armed with these tools will find even that bugbear, the recent literature, less formidable. And not surprisingly, learning medicine this way takes less time than the ravenous accumulation of information that can neither be retrieved nor put to use, a sort of library without index. When the time thus saved is used in developing one's humanity, the dividends of these economies are multiplied, and one is on the way

to becoming a scientific and humane physician. Admittedly few arrive, but the goal is worthy of pursuit and even setting our eyes on it ennoble us.

Why am I writing this in Toubib ? Because in a modest way Toubib illustrates my point. Good students of medicine, without neglecting their duties, have found the time to produce a work of art and humour. They have added a small dimension to their professional life, asserted their humanity and contributed to our enjoyment. I thank and congratulate them.

ETHICS IN OPHTHALMOLOGY

The Medical code of Ethics, as it relates to the field of Ophthalmology, has been the subject of extensive discussions in many Ophthalmological Meetings. Rules of Ethics were set to guide the Ophthalmogist; and to advance the best interests of patients receiving Ophthalmological care.

The last 2-3 decades have witnessed many developments in the field of Ophthalmology which had many implications on the ethical side of the profession. These developments are the following:

1. High Technology:

Since 1960, high technology moved rapidly in the fields of eye diagnosis and treatment. Electrophysiological tests; specular microscopy; indirect ophthalmoscopy; fluorescein angiography; ultrasonography etc... etc... are amongst the many newly introduced disciplines in diagnostics.

Microsurgery; cryosurgery; lasers etc... etc... are the leading new modalities in the treatment of eye diseases.

2. Specialization:

The rapid growth in our knowledge in Ophthalmology necessitated specialization in certain aspects of eye diseases. Currently, there are at least 6 well defined subspecialties in Ophthalmology.

The question now is the following: How do the forementioned developments affect the ethical standards of ophthalmological practice, especially in our troubled country Lebanon?

Uptill the mid-sixties, a well trained ophthalmologist meant a physician who could treat a red eye, prescribe glasses, and do good cataract surgery. Nowadays, such functions have become the duties of young trainees in Ophthalmology, as well as allied health personnel!

Many well established ophthalmologists in Lebanon were trained in Otolaryngology and still practice double specialties. As a matter of fact, most of the present practicing ophthalmologists in Lebanon are general ophthalmologists without any subspecialization. This has created lots of competition between the general ophthalmologist serving in the country side, and the subspecialists practicing in large cities and in University setups. Unfortunately, many a time, such competition lead to an unfair and unethical eye care practice.

High technology in Ophthalmology, with its so many sophisticated instrumentation, has its glamour and appeal, to both the eye surgeon and the patient. To the public, a well-trained ophthalmologist meant someone who has, and uses, lots of expensive push-button instrumentation! As a consequence, and due to the total lack of specialized Eye Hospitals in Lebanon, the practicing ophthalmologist personally invested, and very heavily, in the purchase of eye equipment. This financial investment resulted in many ethical problems such as overcharging, and performing unnecessary diagnostic testing and unindicated surgeries.

In conclusion, it is clear that the Hippocratic Oath can't solve alone all the ethical problems of a rapidly advancing, and very sophisticated medical specialty, such as Ophthalmology. New knowledge will have to be spread to all ophthalmologists: University centers, and Ophthalmological organizations have the obligation of making the congenial practrice of Ophthalmology available to all ophthalmologists. Endeavors, such as continuing medical education courses; specially journals; specialty hospitals; have to be encouraged.

Rules of ethics are general guidelines that can't, and should not, replace the self-discipline of the individual physician. Such rules must contain sanctions for violators if they are to be effective.

NURSING SERVICE

May you first permit me to congratulate each and every member of Toubib for the efforts you are putting to keep Toubib alive. I would also like to thank you for giving me this opportunity to share with you in this issue.

In the year 1976, as a new graduate, I believed in nursing as a service to the sick & to the well. As a head nurse on 5 South, nursing to me became teaching those nurses on my unit to give the best possible care to the patient. As a supervisor, on one hand I had less contact with patients, on the other hand more involvement with the medical staff, with the daily activities of the hospital and with one goal in mind «Better Patient Care», and finally as a nursing director, I have the opportunity to change, the challenge to promote the nursing profession against all odds! We have no barriers, we use our prerogatives of cure and care without discrimination of race or creed or colour or nationality. We have a common language which is not necessarily set down in words or phrases. It does not have to be spoken. It is the language of a common purpose and we do not necessarily have to express ourselves in words to know that our motives will be understood.

It is the times of chaos that medicine and nursing make their greatest strides. Haven't we all for the past 10 years and continue to do so in the most difficult times?

am confident that we did the very best we could not by individual effort but by all working as a team

As a Director of Nursing, I will always believe that yesterday, today and in the future the nursing and medical profession will remain the best, because what profession can give you so much happiness, so much sadness which brings tears, but gives you the opportunity to turn the tears to smiles for others?
