Why is it that some universities ossify and others continue to grow? I am not sure I know the answer. * What a man ought never to forget with regard to a college is that it is a nursery of principle and honor.., I cannot admit that a man establishes his right to call himself a college graduate by showing me his diploma. The only way he can prove it is by showing that his eyes are lifted to some horizon which other men less instructed than he have not been privileged to see... You are here in order to enable the world to live more amply, with greater vision, with a finer spirit of hope and achievement. You are here to enrich the world, and you impoverish yourself if you forget the errand.

May I congratulate the Student Board of Managers upon this fine Yearbook. You are worthy successors to those who created the first and never-to-be-forgotten all-University Yearbook, the Campus of 1963. The Campus of 1964 will serve as a tangible reminder of your years of study and effort at this University. We hope it mill evoke happy memories of your sojourn here.

Good luck and best wishes to those who people this book, to all those who helped create it, and to those who turn its pages with pride and joy.



Message from the Dean for Yearbook:

To All Students in the School of Engineering:

This is a time in history when the ever-increasing tempo of scientific and technological advance is one of the dominant factors in the world scene. When we consider the changes that have taken place during the past few decades, we can say with certainty that developments during the next forty years will stagger the imagination. With advances in transportation and communication, we know that the world grows smaller; and few places in this ever-smaller world will be exempt from the impact of these changes.

The forty years ahead are the very years when today's students in Engineering tand Architecture will be having their careers. I can predict with confidence, therefore, that many of you, during your careers, will have to find solutions to problems so new that they cannot even be defined today.

The professions encompased by the Faculty of Engineering are, and will always be, based on both Science and Art. Both of these are important in solving the problems that we know about today, and both will be important in meeting the problems of tomorrow. But you will be increasingly glad as the years go by, that your studies at A. U. B. have had their base in Mathematics and in Science. Let us always remember that, in the last analysis, the worth of new structures and new machines is measured, not in units of mass or of time or distance, but by the dimensions of human values.

JOHN B. WILBUR

Born in Oakland, Maine, in 1904. S. B., S. M., and Sc. D. from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Wide professional experience includes: structural draftsman for the Maine Central Railroad, bridge designer for the New York Central Railroad, chief engineer for the Smith Putnam Wind Tunnel Project for S. Morgan Smith Company of York, Pennsylvania, and chief engineer for the Boston Central Artery. For many years and until recently was a consultant for the well known firm Fay, Spofford & Thorndike, of Boston, Massachusetts. Member of the honorary societies of Sigma Si and Tau Beta Pi. Fellow of the American Society of Civil Engineers and a past president of the Massachusetts Section; member and past president of the Boston Society of Civil Engineers; member of American Society for Engineering Education, Society for Experimental Stress Analysis, and the American Association for the Advancement of Science. Served in above organizations as speaker and discussion leader. Contributed many articles to various professional journals. In recent years has been especially concerned with the development of the engineering education. Co. — author with Prof. Norris of the Theory of Statistically Indeterminate Structures and Elementary structural Analysis, which has been the Structures textbook in the School of Engineering for many years. Worked through the ranks of graduate assistant, instructor, assistant professor, associate professor and full professor at M.I.T. where he was appointed acting head of the Department of Civil and Sanitary Engineering in 1944, and head in 1946 — in which position he served until 1960 when he went into semi-retirement but continued to act as Consulting Professor at M.I.T. Assumed office as Dean of the School of Engineering, A.U.B., early in January 1964.



GRADUATE STUDIES IN THE FACULTY OF ENGINEERING

The offering of postgraduated studies in the Faculty of Engineering was started in October 1956 with courses in Structures and Hydraulics. The first Master of Engineering degrees were granted to three Pakistani students in June 1958. Each of these had completed two years of study in residence at A. U. B., after receiving the Bachelor's degree.

In 1959, Mr. Edmond Pasha, an AUB graduated of the class of 1952, was granted the degree of Master of Engineering. He had been required to complete all the undergraduate work which had been initiated since he graduated. After he had completed most of his work, this rigorous policy was modified. Present policy requires the holders of a Bachelor's degree from a recognized school of engineering to complete only those undergraduate engineering courses of the AUB curriculum which are in the sequences actually prerequisite to the proposed graduate major of the student.

In the spring of 1962, after much investigation and study, a modified graduate program was approved permitting specialization in Sanitary Engineering. The graduate programs now require the completion of a minimum of 30 credit hours of specified work, including a project of 6 credit hours, and involve a minimum of one year of study, including the summer, which is normally devoted to the project. In October 1962, two full-time and five part-time students were registered in this program.

In October 1963, a further modification of the program of study permitting specialization in Civil Engineering was introduced and started by thirteen students. This year, eleven students were enrolled in the Sanitary Engineering program.

The University Survey Report of 1961 on "The Future Role and Needs of AUB" recommends the expansion of graduate work. The members of the Faculty of Engineering are in full accord with this objective and have taken initiative in its implementation.

You will now be seriously confronted for the first time by the economic and social problems of medicine. They deserve your special attention because, as a physician, they become your responsibility. You are no longer a free agent. You have earned your place as a vital and priceless resource of the community.

Some Aspects of the History of Our Medical School*

The American Board of Foreign Missions began operating in the region known as Lebanon, Syria and Palestine in 1820, and by 1860 had established 33 schools. In 1862 Reverend Daniel Bliss was asked to withdraw from evangelical work to found a school of higher learning which would include medical training. Accordingly, Dr. Bliss traveled to the USA, and on April 24, 1863, the State Of New York granted a charter for the new school which was to be known as the Syrian Protestant College. Dr. Bliss was appointed president of the college which opened in the autumn of 1866 with a class of 16 students, and the medical school opened, the following year with a class of fourteen students.

The early history of the medical school is inseparable from that of three outstanding professors who helped found the school in 1867 and guide it during the first 15 years. These three men were Dr. Cornelius Van Dyck, an outstanding Arabic scholar, who taught chemistry, pathology, internal medicine and ophthalmology; Dr. George Post was a great surgeon and taught botany, and materia medica; Dr. John Wortabet, born in Lebanon, taught anatomy, physiology, public health and the practice of medicine. Each of these three unusual men gave full time to the teaching of a 4-year medical course, at first in Arabic, so each translated medical texts and lectures into Arabic.

The 97 years of growth and development of the medical school have not been without crises. In 1882 Professor Edwin Lewis gave a commencement address favoring the theories of Darwin. The board of trustees and the non-medical faculty were so offended that Professor Lewis was forced to resign. All the full-time members of the medical faculty joined with their resignations except for Dr. Post. Many of the medical students also rebelled and were temporarily suspended. So it appeared that the career of the flourishing young medical school might suddenly be brought to an end, but three new professors arrived in time for the opening of the academic year 1883 - 84. Thus the medical school weathered its first serious crisis. A significant side effect, however, was a change in the language of instruction from Arabic to English, because the new professors did not know Arabic and did not have time to learn it before beginning their duties.

The 1914-18 war presented the medical school with another crisis, but the school continued under great difficulties in spite of being an American institution within alien territory. The Turkish leader Jamal Pasha was favorably impressed when he found graduates of the medical school willing to serve the typhus wards and in the front-line dressing stations. It was he who refused to permit the school to be closed when America entered the war, and 32 medical graduates gave up their lives in active service during the war.

Following the war renewed interest in the university and its medical school was taken by the trustees and many supporters. The new countries of Lebanan, Syria, Iraq, Palestine and Transfordan looked to the university to train leaders in every field of public life.

Changes of time had caused the name Syrian Protestant College to become outmoded, so the board of regents of New York State amended the charter on November 18. 1920, and the institution became known as the American University of Beirut.

It was during this post-war period that the Rockefeller Foundation, and others, began their continuing guidance and assistance with periodic grants which have enabled the medical school to improve its physicol plant and teaching staff. Another generation of leaders joined the faculty at this time, including Drs. William Cruikshank, Edward Turner, Bennett Avery, William Shanklin, Stanley Kerr, and George Miller.

The Second World War presented the institution with yet another crisis. The people of the region and the occupying power again derived benefits from the medical school, not only through medical services rendered, but also from the production of vaccines by the bacteriology department upon which the government had long relied.


Increased tensions were experienced by the university during and following the partition of Palestine in 1947-48, the Suez crisis in 1956, and the Lebanese political crisis in 1958. However, these events did not affect the medical school, for its students again showed a high degree of maturity and the faculty members effective leadership.

Now, the medical school stands high among the faculties of AUB and the medical schools in other parts of the world. It offers the medical student 5 years of higher learning and professional training. During the first 2 preclinical years, the student is taught courses in basic sciences including Anatomy, Histology, Physiology, Biochemistry, Bacteriology, Parasitology, Pathology, and Pharmacology. In the last 3 years he works in the hospital and the outpatient department, and he graduates, at the end of 5 years, having developed and mastered the art of dealing with and healing the sick.

Second Pharmacy Seminar*

The Second Pharmacy Seminar organized by the School of Pharmacy for its graduates was held on Saturday, May 11 and Sunday May 12 at the Alumni Club. A good number of Pharmacy Alumni from Lebanon, Syria, Jordan, Kuwait, Ethiopia, and Saudi Arabia participated.

The opening session was held at 9:15 a.m. on Saturday. The Director of the School of Pharmacy, Professor Amin Haddad introduced Dr. Samuel Kirkwood, Dean of the Faculties of Medical Sciences who welcomed the participants and spoke of the important role the pharmacist plays in the fight against disease. Dean Kirkwood then stressed the importance of the ethical principles on which is based the professional practice of pharmacy.

The lecture sessions were held at hourly intervals with a coffee break in between. Six lectures were given in the following order: "Factors Effecting Drug Stability" by Prof. A. Haddad; "Aerosols" by Prof. M. Harrison, followed by a film; "New Drugs from Plants" by Prof. C. Abou Chaar; "Anabolic and Androgenic Hormones" by Prof. L. Karamanukian; "Biochemical Approach to the Study of Disease and Therapy by Prof. I Durr; and "Mental Illness, Etiology and its Treatment" by Prof. R. Dajani.

On Saturday evening a dinner was held in honor of Dean and Mrs. S. B. Kirkwood. Also present was Mr.





A. S. Crawford, Vice President of the University. Immediately after the dinner a documentary film about Lebanon was shown through the kind courtesy of the Middle East Airlines. On the same evening the Pharmacy Students Society held its Annual Ball which was organized for the occasion. Among the many attractions and activities the election of Miss Pharmacy for 1963 took place. Miss Chaké Kouyoumjian was elected.

On Sunday afternoon a visit to the School of Pharmacy was organized to view the machinery and equipments recently acquired by the School. This activity was conducted by Mr. Uthman Kanafani, Miss Yeranouhi Kouyoumjian, and Miss Chaké Kouyoumjian with the cooperation of the graduating class.


Recent studies in the School of Public Health have disclosed the first known focus of schistosomiasis in Lebanon. As part of countrywide survey, graduate students in Tropical Health collect and identify snall vectors of schistosoma heamatobium from an Irrigation ditch.

Research on hydatid disease in the Department of Tropical Heath has been partially directed to the chemical fractionation and characterization of diagnostic antigens. Here mucopolysaccharide fractions isolated from hydatid cyst tissues are being separated by a staff member and a graduate student for assay against an international standard reference serum prepared for the World Health Organization.









CAUTION

Coliform organisms become resistant rapidly to oral streptomycin alone; on the other hand, streptomycin has the advantage of reducing the enter-ococcus population quickly. It should, therefore, be given preoperatively for not more than 2 to 3 days.

While untoward effects associated with sulfonamide therapy are greatly reduced by the use of this preparation, vigilance should not be relaxed in the search for and recognition of agranulocytosis, fever, joint pains, skin reactions, etc. Sufficient fluids should be administered to maintain a urinary output of 1000 to 1500 cc. in 24 hours.




