

Democracy Will Prevail

Looking back at a difficult year, we realize that there is little to say that has not been said before. It is not necessary to recount the numerous obstacles that have stood in the way of a return to democracy at AUB. We believe that we have exerted all possible efforts to remove those obstacles through sincere and open dialogue with students, faculty and administration. As small and limited student societies, we have tried and at times succeeded in playing the role that was not really our's, but rather the Student Council's. Our various attempts and failures at promoting democratic process at AUB are well known to the university community. The subsequent breakdown of democracy and the deterioration of student-administration relations have brought this academic year to a dissapointing end.

We felt though, that it was vitally important to show that our belief in democracy went beyond mere verbal commitment. It was important because we were aware of our responsibility to provide AUB students with the chance to exercise one of their most basic rights — freedom of expression. It was important, we felt, to exhibit to Lebanon and the Arab World that for at least a part of the AUB community, democracy lived on, despite the prevailing situation fostered by the administration. Therefore, OUR CAMPUS.

Just as the administration stood in the way of OUTLOOK and other democratic channels of expression in AUB, it stood in the way of an important AUB student tradition, CAMPUS. We were determined to produce our yearbook whatever the cost, effort or risk. So, in short time, with limited financial support and under the threat of administrative intervention, we collectively pooled our resources. OUR CAMPUS, virtually the only remaining form of democratic student expression is the product of those efforts. The recent violence done to democratic freedom in Lebanon delayed the appearance of OUR CAMPUS. Furthermore, we sincerely apologize for any mistakes in typing or identification and we hope that such mistakes will not seriously impair its value as a record.

We fear for the future of AUB. This apprehension is grounded not only in the gradual demise of student-administration relations and the present abnormal situation among our students. It springs, too, from the implicit threats made this year that this or that department or school may be closed down and faculty laid off because of financial problems. We fear not only for the cultural, political and social reputation of AUB as an integral and positive part of Lebanon and the Arab World. We also fear for the academic and educational reputation of AUB. It was this that moved us to express our apprehensions for the future of AUB.

We present this yearbook to our fellow students in the hope that it will serve as a lasting reminder to all, that the struggle for democracy at AUB continues. We are certain that ultimately, democracy will prevail.





The Memorandum Once Again

To: President S.B. Kirkwood and University Senate Members

Dear Sirs:

This memorandum is submitted out of sincere and firm belief in this university and in the necessity of restoring an open and fruitful dialogue between students, faculty and administration so that the University can continue to fulfill a constructive role in the area. We are well aware of the dangers facing the A.U.B. and are especially concerned about the financial crisis to which President Kirkwood has so often alluded to in recent months. We feel that we too must share the responsibility of finding a solution to this crisis. Had we been asked to suggest alternatives to tuition increases in the past, the University may well have been spared the crippling strikes of 1971 and 1974 whose effects have undoubtedly made themselves felt in the present financial crisis. Unhappily for all concerned, a crisis of confidence preceded the present crisis of finance. If we can solve this crisis of confidence, we may still contribute to a secure future for the University. We submit this memorandum, asking that it be considered as a contribution towards the restoration of a healthy relationship between the three bodies that make up the University. It can be considered our answer to the efforts undertaken by the Senate last year to institute a student-faculty dialogue and to the group of faculty members who, in their Ad-hoc committees, attempted to determine our views on various issues of mutual concern. The times then were not propitious: the campus had been invaded by police and the atmosphere was tense. Opinions were sometimes expressed in the heat of controversy. Though sincere, they may at times have been misinterpreted. We urge that this dialogue be resumed in any form possible in order to discuss the following issues:

1. The present situation on campus.

A number of measures were taken by President Kirkwood which have restricted student activity on campus to an absolute minimum. We do not feel that these measures are justified. The Hyde Park corner has been suspended. Intellectual talks and political lectures have been, for all practical purposes, banned. We believe that the University is not a place where one learns from books only: it is not just a factory of knowledge. It must be a total educational and cultural environment in which the student must be given the opportunity to live in and to understand his milieu. The student must be allowed the chance to study, weigh, and respond to the social, political and economic problems which beset the region. Outside activities are an essential part of this « total education ».

For example, we asked to hold a « Week for the South of Lebanon » to express our concern over a vital issue. The obstacles put in our path and, finally, the total ban imposed, served only to widen the confidence gap between us and the administration. We saw no justification for this ban. Therefore we suggest that these measures be rescinded. We, on our part, will continue to act within the rules and regulations laid down by the University. In addition, a number of warnings have been issued to students last summer and at the beginning of this semester. These warnings serve as a constant threat to the freedom of expression which the University guarantees its students. These warnings are self-defeating because they are in such stark contrast to the values and philosophies we are exposed to in the classroom. We ask you to reconsider these measures or

at least allow them to appear before the relevant committees to defend ourselves. The campus is « calm » but we don't have a healthy normalcy.

2. Student Council

Following last years strike, the president dissolved the Council. He acted within his constitutional rights in doing so but did not call for new elections within eight weeks of its dissolutions as required by the constitution. Instead, he suspended the constitution itself and turned it over to the Senate for review. To date, it remains suspended. We cannot believe that any University can function normally without a democratically elected student council, itself an essential part of the « total education » we alluded to above. While it remains suspended, the confidence gap remains; indeed broadens. Such suspension becomes particularly harmful to a University if that University is undergoing a crisis, as ours is. A student council would indeed help to solve various crisis. So long as it is non-existent, the students cannot contribute to the future of AUB. In addition, its suspension creates one acute human problem. The Student Council Scholarship Committee, which in the past had helped a large number of needy students can no longer do so. As costs go up and the number of needy students increases, the necessity of accommodating them becomes greater.

3. The Students expelled

At the beginning of the year, we asked that the 103 students expelled last year be readmitted. We feel that this is a case where the punishment has far exceeded the « crime ». Expulsion is a final and irrevocable measure which no University known to us resort to except in the most flagrant cases of criminal behaviour. Many of those expelled are in hard situation: student who had only one semester to graduate. Many cannot find places in other universities and have abandoned their careers in mid-stream. Many cannot afford education abroad, in Europe or the USA. We hope you will exert all possible efforts to alleviate this situation and thus take a vital step towards mutual understanding and confidence. A university is never only concerned with the letter of the law but rather with its spirit. Teachers are not policemen.

4. The University's financial crisis

We have from the beginning of the year shown our concern with the financial crisis of AUB. Tuition increases have obviously done little to alleviate the magnitude of the problem. We would like to contribute our time and effort. We can do our share only if we are allowed our constitutional rights. We are very deeply concerned about the prospects of lowering our academic standards or changing the essential nature of the institution.

Once more, we respectfully request you to allow us to work together in order to surmount this gap in faith, without which no university can function properly, let alone survive its financial crisis. We therefore submit this memorandum and ask that you give it due consideration.


Student Organizations in Different Lebanese Universities

Under this theme section there are 3 main parts. The first is a description of the student organizations of three different universities in Lebanon. The second is an interview with Dr. Edmond Naim, President of the Lebanese University. The last part is an article written by Mrs. Khairallah of the Cultural Studies Department.

Although these three sections may seem discontinuous, they have one thing in common. They all throw some insight on the problems a university has to face in establishing a democratic relationship.

THE LEBANESE UNIVERSITY

A simplified chart illustrating student representation at the Lebanese University.




The Congress has the highest authority since it formulates the policy of the Executive Committee. It consists of representatives from the different faculties of the university. The Executive Committee follows up this policy which is then ultimately carried out by the 'Sections' (third body) representing each faculty. Another function of the 'Sections' department is to present reports of valuation and advice. The Bureaux is principally an advisory body whose president has to be a member from the Executive Committee and whose members are those of the 'Sections'. Last but not least, the General Assembly consists of the students of each school and the accumulation of all the different General Assemblies is the Student Body.

Participation of students is possible through this structure. In matters concerning participation in running the unviersity students stress the need for a more direct involvement which they believe is essential for a true democratic atmosphere. We can add that the Lebanese University students have to some extent an effective role with the administration: the student body is well

organised.

ST. JOSEPH UNIVERSITY

A simplified chart illustrating student representation at the St. Joseph University.



The Student Union is reserved only for Lebanese students. When the members of the Union are meeting, they are in the state of General Assembly. This Assembly elects a representative council. The Council then elects and supervises the Executive Committee with the right to dissolve it if necessary. The president of this committee is the president of the Student Union who represents the Union at all official meetings.

The Chancellor, who plays a crucial role in the process of decision making, restricts to a large extent the student's freedom: Article 50 of the constitution of the student associations states that the student union cannot invite any personality to hold a conference without the prior acceptance of the Chancellor. Also, Article 97 points out that the Chancellor will never give his acceptance to a political conference.

The Corporations role is to organize student-faculty-administration relations on academic matters; they are constituted on a departmental basis. When in meeting, the students of « traverse


dirige's » groups elect their Corporative Bureau.

The Constitution of the Corporation or of the Executive Committee cannot be revised if the Status Committee has not given its approval. The members of this Status Committee are the Chancellor who presides the meetings, two faculty members and two students.

Most important is the fact that the administration has profited from the weakness of the student body, that is from the absence of organisation around a central committee of legal representatives, and has suspended the constitution and made the student-administration relation a one-way direction.

BEIRUT UNIVERSITY COLLEGE

A simplified chart illustrating student representation at the Beirut University College



The Student Association elects a student government made up of three parts :

 the student parliament who assumes the legislative function: initiation of new rules and regulations

- the student cabinet, the executive branch and its president who is the president of the student association

- the student court which studies all disciplinary cases.

The constitution provides the existence of 7 committees, the president of each is a student cabinet member. The committees are the following:

- Recreational and cultural committee
- Boarders' committee
- Academic committee
- Publication committee
- Orientation committee
- Health and order committee
- the Social service committee

All the student-organizations must have a faculty adviser. At a first glimpse one may think that the B.U.C. has a highly sophisticated organization but in reality, B.U.C. has had its conflicts which can only be resolved through effective student participation.



٢ ـ ماذا كان وقع ممارسات الطُّلاب اللا اكاديمية على الجامعة اللبنانية ؟

ADVISORY COMMITTEE: Among the various faculty committees (such as Curriculum, Library, Scholarship, etc.) dealing with academic matters, this is the most important. The members are elected by the faculty at the recommendation of the Committee and consists of tenured professors (that is, faculty members on a life-time appointment) whose role (as the name of the committee implies) consists of advising the Dean of Faculty on issues concerning hiring, promotions, etc. Their power does not extend further than advising and recommending. The Dean holds veto power.

BOARD OF DEANS: It is the chief academic administrative body, Meetings are presided by the President. The Provost also sits at the meetings. Any recommendation on academic matters from a Faculty goes to the Board of Deans.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES: A self-perpetuating body of a generally conservative nature. They are self-administrative and hold the ultimate power of the University. As stated in their by-laws: « The University through its appointed officers shall be under the direction of the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees shall be the ultimate authority in affairs of the University. » The number of members is not fixed and at present amounts to about twenty. Criteria for electing new members are various: a general interest in the Middle East; businessmen in oil, banks, companies with interests in the Middle East; an interest in medicine; and finally, an interest in education. The President and on the latter's recommendation, the Vice-Presidents, Deans, Comptroller and Director of the New York office are all appointed by the Board. In addition, faculty promotions (Professorship, Associate Professorship and tenure) are given by the Board on the recommendation of the President.

FACULTY: The least powerful body in the University. Their opinions or decisions concerning academic and administrative matters are voiced as recommendations to the Senate. These decisions cannot counter or violate decisions made by all the other bodies mentioned in this ABC. Changes in their by-laws have to be approved by the Senate (see below).

PRESIDENT: The Chief Executive and Academic Officer. He acts as liaison officer between the Board of Trustees and the administration, faculty, community, government, etc. The President meets with the Board of Trustees (of which he is an ex-officio member allowed to vote) at every convened session, prepares the agenda and participates in the discussion. A number of University Administrators accompany him. Apart from wider financial and academic issues, the Board of



Trustees does not generally interfere in decisions made by the President.

SENATE: Responsible for general academic policy as an advisory body to the President. It may recommend through the President suggestions or reforms to the Board of Trustees. Meetings are called by the President who chairs them. Each Faculty or School elects its own Senate representatives in its own way. In the case of Medicine, Pharmacy and Public Health, it is a number of administrators who automatically represent their Faculty. In Arts and Science, the Advisory Committee recommends names of Faculty members to the rest of the Faculty who hold an election. Nominations from the floor are permissible.

The composition of the Senate: President, vice-Presidents, Provost, Deans, Dean of Student Affairs, Registrar, Distinguished Professors, Regular Members. The latter all hold the right to vote except for the Distinguished Professors (who only hold the right to speak).

Here is a list of Senate regular members (i.e., faculty members):

Alternate members (who vote only when a regular member is absent : 9


The Senate regular members hence consist of nineteen members of the faculty who although hypothetically are supposed to represent fifty percent of the Senate Body do not do so in effect. The Senate is dominated by Administration by and large and the regular members almost never outvote the Administration.

UNIVERSITY COUNCIL: An advisory body to the President. It consists of the President and a representative of each Faculty. Three of those are chosen by election and one by the President. The election proceeds in two stages: The faculty chooses two representatives and present their choice to the Senate who in turn chooses one out of the two.














« Mr President,






